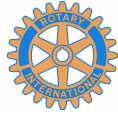
Vocational Service – TRF – including Post Graduate Scholarships, GSE, 3H Programme, POLIOPLUS.

At the conclusion of the working bee at the Showgrounds, soft drinks will be provided.

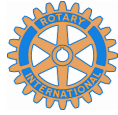
Tuesday 27th and Wednesday 28th October –

Then he blushed. Then the two turned once again to gaze out over the loch before the girl spoke again.

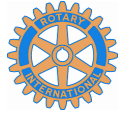
"Another penny for your thoughts, Angus."
