SOME OF THE GUEST SPEAKERS

Ron Rapee AM

Rapee is Distinguished Professor of Psychology Ron at Macquarie University and an Australian Research Council Laureate Fellow. He specializes in mental health, especially in anxiety and related disorders across the lifespan. He has developed a number of empirically supported treatment programs that are used across the world and has been honoured by awards from both scientific and consumer groups. His recent work has focused on prevention of anxiety and depression as well as on public dissemination and access to empirically validated programs. Prof Rapee received the Distinguished Career Award from the Australian Association for CBT and the Distinguished Contribution to Science Award from the Australian Psychological Society. He was awarded a Member of the Order of Australia in 2012 for his contributions to clinical psychology, especially among young people. Ron Rapee is introducing the Cool Kids project at our Conference.



Scott Tilyard APM

Deputy Police Commissioner Scott Tilyard has been a member of the Tasmania Police Service since 1981. He was appointed to the position of Deputy Commissioner in 2011. Scott is a member of Tasmania's Sentencing Advisory Council, Deputy Chair of the Tasmania Police Charity Trust Board, and independent Chair of the Department of Communities Tasmania, Children and Youth Services - Serious Events Review Committee.



Una Hobday

Una is the Chair of Food Plant Solutions (FPS), an international Rotarian Action Group (RAG) based here in Tasmania. She will present a new program called 'Fresh Food for Families' which is currently being introduced by FPS. The Nepalese community program was facilitated by members of FPS RAG, Rotary clubs of North Hobart and Hobart, and members of the Royal Society of Tasmania, with support of a grant from the Government. Its aim was to support new Tasmanian's to learn about growing and harvesting good nutritious food for their children, in different circumstances from where they have come. You will hear from a member of the Nepalese new Tasmanian's at the conference. A 'How to' book has been produced from this workshop, which would enable any Rotary club to pick up this program and run it in their community. The same group will be running the second workshop with the Ethiopian Community the weekend before the conference.
