On Saturday we had the District Assembly at the Rotary Function Centre and it was well attended by Rotarians from all over the State. Like most of you, I have been to many District Assemblies and I am amazed that I can still learn so much more about Rotary. During our Club Assembly this week, we will be able to pass on the latest news.

MUNA is being held this coming weekend and those having billets have by now been given the names of their students. Many others will be assisting on the Saturday and Sunday but more volunteers would be appreciated, I am sure. It is also good to have Rotarians, friends and families to come along and observe, as it is very important for the young people to see how well supported MUNA is and I am sure it gives them impetus to perform better. Please come along, even if it is for only half an hour and I believe you will be very impressed with these young people.

Later this month, Ines will undertake a 3-day sail on Windeward Bound and she can't wait for it to happen. Deloraine High was also approached to see if they had a young Year 10 student whom they felt would really benefit from the voyage and they have come up with the name of a boy. An anonymous Rotarian has paid the \$317 which is our cost for the sail. The State Government, via the Department of State Growth pays most of the cost of the sail with the remainder to be paid either by the student or by Rotary or donor. On the middle day, a careers' person will join the ship and will interact with the young people and in general talk to them about how best to prepare themselves for their futures. Having crewed on the James Craig for years and also having sailed on Windeward Bound once out of Sydney, I know just how good Captain Sarah Parry is and I envy Ines and the other student very much!
