VOYAGE DATES — APRIL TO NOVEMBER 2023

WHAT IS THE PROGRAM ABOUT?

The Windeward Bound Trust and Rotary Tasmania and Rotary Queensland have joined together to continue this special leadership development program.

In 2023 250 young people will have the opportunity to join Captain Sarah Perry and her crew aboard the Sail Training Vessel Windeward Bound on a series ten day voyage along Eastern Australia's coast line.

50% will be young local Australian chosen because of their leadership potential. The other 50% will be New Australian Youth from refugee backgrounds who show potential to benefit from the experience.

No sailing experience is necessary. This program is fortunate to receive generous financial support from a number of sponsors, which allows us to significantly reduce the cost for all participants.

WHY SAIL TRAINING?

This adventure is about living, working and playing with people who haven't met before. The Uncommon Origins of Some Common Expressions

GO THROUGH FIRE AND WATER

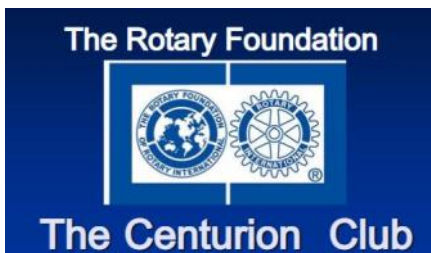
The origin of this phrase lies not in the suffering that any fire and water can produce, but more specifically in the ‘ordeal of fire’ and the ‘ordeal of water’ - methods of legal trial in England during the Middle Ages.

The term *ordeal* comes from *ordel*, an Old English word meaning ‘judgment’. The idea underlying the legal ordeal was that God, rather than man, should sit in judgment. Since God would not allow an innocent person to be falsely convicted, He would intercede and protect that person. In ‘ordeal of battle’, for instance—when the two opponents in a lawsuit would fight a duel—God would ensure that the party with the just cause would triumph.

The ordeals of fire and water were used more in criminal cases than in civil lawsuits. Each ordeal took one of two forms. In the ordeal of fire, typically imposed on noblemen, the accused would either have to grasp a red-hot iron bar in his hand, or have to walk barefoot and blindfolded between red-hot iron ploughshares. If, after three days, he was considered not guilty—God had protected the innocent.

In the ordeal of water, typically reserved for commoners, the accused would have to plunge his hand into a tub of boiling water. If his skin showed little sign of scalding, he was again considered innocent. (One imagines that the proportion of not-guilty verdicts in the medieval trials was rather low.) The other ordeal of water—of cold water this time—was a common test for suspected witches. The accused was tied up and pushed into a pond. If she floated, she was considered guilty—because the water had refused her—and often put to death. If she sank this was proof that the accusations were baseless—though the woman would be lucky to escape drowning in the process.

To *go through fire and water*, then, is to undergo almost any ordeal—in both senses of that word—in pursuit of one’s desire.
