HAPPY WORLD PEACE AND UNDERSTANDING DAY

The first meeting of Rotary International took place in Chicago, Illinois, USA on 23rd February, 1905. Rotary celebrates that date now as World Peace and Understanding. For 119 years now, Rotary clubs have been driven by the desire to give peace a chance.

District Governor Mike Patten OAM had a column published in The Mercury for this day. It is the third he has had published this year, writing first on World Peace Day, then again on World Polio Day. (Article re-printed on next page)

Rotary programs still aim to give peace a chance around the world's hot spots

otarians around the world have a long and strong commitment to world peace. At its world conference in 1914 Rotary International committed to "... lend its influence to the maintenance of peace amongst the nations of the world."

At the 1921 conference this commitment to peace and goodwill was included as part of the Rotary ideal of service.

During the turbulent years of the 1930s and 40s Rotary promoted the concept of peace and goodwill as a

where countries lack the natural resources or space to cater for their inhabitants' needs, where natural disasters or other events disrupt established governance and/or where leaders turn to conflict to gain or retain power.

In Rotary, we shift the focus from what we can't change to what we can do. Food security, housing, water, health services and education are effective protection against conflict, and these are the areas that are the focus of Rotary projects.

Rotary provides ordinary Australians an opportunity to make a

human right. In 1945 Rotary was invited to contribute to the UN Charter Conference in San Francisco. Both UNESCO and the World Health Organisation extend consultative status to Rotary International.

Peace and conflict resolution is still the first of Rotary's seven areas of focus. With so much death and destruction happening all over the

difference. At a local level Rotarians are installing Peace Poles in schools, parks, and community centres. We are funding a student to attend a twovear course at one of the eight tertiary Peace Centres which Rotary has established in universities scattered around the world. We provide funds and staff to support medical services, education, food and water in Africa. the island nations in the Pacific and in Southeast Asia. We provide youth programs to develop leadership and resilience and we support a growing number Interact clubs in schools around the state.

world and with the potential for even more conflict facing communities everywhere, ordinary Australians face the serious question, "What can we do to achieve peace?"

Rotary International has a range of strategies to answer this question and Rotary in Tasmania is quietly doing its part.

Peace and conflict resolution is multifaceted. Conflict often arises

Rotary in Tasmania also supports two projects of international significance.

Food Plant Solutions Rotary
Action Group is now global, but
builds on a plant database created by
Tasmanian Bruce French AO, to end
malnutrition by improving nutrition
in communities in Africa, Southeast
Asia and the Pacific. Growing food
plants that are nutritious and suit the
local growing conditions seems such
a simple idea, but it took Bruce
French and a group of Tasmanians to
make that possible.

Rotarians Against Malaria is

another project with a strong Tasmanian link. Malaria is a Rotary focus around the world but a combination of Tasmanian expertise, locally raised funds and grants from The Rotary Foundation has resulted in a significant reduction in malaria cases in Australia's near neighbours in South East Asia and the Pacific. In Timor Leste there were once 24 000 cases a year. Now there is not one.

The Rotary Foundation is a key component in allowing Rotarians to be people of action across the world. Famous for the highly successful End Polio Now program, Rotarians

around the world raise funds for our foundation. These funds are then available for local Rotary clubs and therefore local Rotarians to apply for the funds needed to carry out significant projects. By addressing what we can change, Rotarians can make a difference. February is our Peace and Conflict Resolution/Prevention Month. You might like to consider joining us in our quest for peace.

For Rotary:

- 1. Directorate nominated on Roster is responsible for set up and pack up. If not available please arrange own change.
- 2. Set-Up
 - a) Obtain code from Ann 041 111 6480
 - b) Tables into correct position and to set tables with Cutlery,

Rotary Placemats, Salt, Pepper, Serviettes, Water Carafes (Note—tablecloths to be used only for 'special' occasions)

- c) To ensure that glasses are either placed on side table with drinks. Note: Only one bottle of red and one bottle of white to be opened at beginning of night, if more are required these are held at the President's table.
- d) To place on table with urn—mugs, spoons, tea, coffee etc. Ensure urn is turned on
- e) Heaters on (as required)
- f) Set up PA System
- g) Assist with Attendance (check Weekly Duties list)
- **3.** Pack-Up (assistance from all Rotarians appreciated)
 - a) Everything off tables and back to kitchen
 - b) At the end of the night all opened bottles of wine should be removed from the Function Centre
 - c) Pack up PA system
 - d) When tablecloths are used, to take home and wash
 - e) Tables and chairs—put away
 - f) Check toilets
 - g) Lights off, lock up and keys back in box.
