ROTARY HISTORY

Did you know that the Inaugural Tasmanian Cottage Industry and Craft Fair was held in Deloraine on 2nd and 3rd November, 1981?

AN IDEA FORMED

During the decades prior to 1980 we lived in an era known as the "hippie" years. The "make love not war" period. Movement of younger people around the nation was very high as individuals dropped out of society and sought "peace" in other fashions. These nomadic groups congregated in various locations and one such location was Deloraine.

Strangers to the community were squatting/settling in groups supposedly living on the dole and bludging on society. The apparent freeloading on society caused friction. Within any community any divisions between the new comers and the established more conservative residents soon became noticeable.

The ever increasing gap with associated uneasiness between the groups was identified by Deloraine Rotarian, John Sullivan.

He also discovered that many of these newcomers had skills with their hands that were not previously seen within the Deloraine community. The skills ranged from working with clay, hides, timber, metals, stone, to mention a few. John identified that if these crafts people could be provided with an opportunity to sell their products, then they would be seen to become contributors to society.

This idea of John's led to the Inaugural Tasmanian Cottage Industry and Craft Fair in Deloraine on 2nd and 3rd November, 1981.

Last week John Carswell spoke to the Club with regards to his bushwalking and the many treks he has undertaken. He made mention of climbing the Abels, and here is a definition of what the Abels are:

"The Abels refer to a group of 158 Tasmanian mountains that stand above 1100 meters and have a prominence of at least 150 meters. These peaks are listed in the book titled "The Abels". Climbing all these mountains is an integral part of the Tasmanian peakbagging movement. The concept of the Abels was devised by Bill Wilkinson in 1994, inspired by the Munros in Scotland. Many of these Abels are extremely remote, necessitating lengthy hikes into the South West Wilderness, including iconic peaks like Federation Peak and Precipitous Bluff."

SET UP — COMMUNITY SERVICE TUESDAY 2nd APRIL

For Rotary:

- **1.** Directorate nominated on Roster is responsible for set up and pack up. If not available please arrange own change.
- 2. Set-Up
 - a) Obtain code from Ann 041 111 6480
 - b) Tables into correct position and to set tables with Cutlery,

Rotary Placemats, Salt, Pepper, Serviettes, Water Carafes (Note—tablecloths to be used only for 'special' occasions)

- c) To ensure that glasses are either placed on side table with drinks. Note: Only one bottle of red and one bottle of white to be opened at beginning of night, if more are required these are held at the President's table.
- d) To place on table with urn—mugs, spoons, tea, coffee etc. Ensure urn is turned on
- e) Heaters on (as required)
- f) Set up PA System
- g) Assist with Attendance (check Weekly Duties list)
- **3.** Pack-Up (assistance from all Rotarians appreciated)
 - a) Everything off tables and back to kitchen
 - b) At the end of the night all opened bottles of wine should be removed from the Function Centre
 - c) Pack up PA system
 - d) When tablecloths are used, to take home and wash
 - e) Tables and chairs—put away
 - f) Check toilets
 - g) Lights off, lock up and keys back in box.
