SATELLITE CLUB FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT IS A SATELLITE CLUB?

Satellite Clubs provide another option for creating Rotary and Rotaract Clubs.

Interested individuals can form a satellite and become full members without meeting the requirement of having at least 20 people to organise a separate Rotary Club, or the recommended 12 to organise a separate Rotaract Club. Satellite clubs can offer an alternative meeting time, place or approach while maintaining close ties with the sponsor club. A satellite club can also function as a transitional step on the way to becoming an independent club.

HOW DOES A CLUB APPLY TO HAVE A SATELLITE CLUB?

For Rotary Clubs, the sponsor Club President sends an *application to the Club and district Support*.

IS THERE A MINIMUM OR MAXIMUM NUMBER OF MEMBERS REQUIRED?

In order to satisfy the requirements of their respective standard club constitutions, Rotary Club Satellites must have a minimum of 8 members.

CAN A STRUGGLING CLUB CONVERT TO A SATELLITE CLUB AND RETAIN ITS CHARTER AND HISTORY?

Satellite Clubs are meant to provide flexibility and an additional club experience option. If members of the struggling club still wish to do so, they can convert to a satellite once they resign their Charter and become members of other clubs.

HOW ARE SATELLITE CLUBS NAMED?

Satellite Clubs use the name of the sponsor Club plus a qualified that distinguishes it from the sponsor, for example

Sponsor: Rotary Club of Deloraine

Satellite: Rotary Satellite Club of Deloraine

SATELLITE CLUB FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

BOARD AND GOVERNANCE:

Can Satellite Clubs create a separate Board with a separate set of Officers from the Sponsor Club?

Satellite Clubs set up their own Board and have their own Officers. However, instead of a President, a Satellite Club has a Chair.

If there are two Boards, how are disagreements handled?

The Board of the Sponsor Club has the final authority when there are disagreements.

Does the leadership of the Satellite Club have a position on the Sponsor Club's Board?

This is highly recommended, but not required.

Can a Satellite Club have separate by-laws?

Yes. The Satellite Club determines its own by-laws in collaboration with its sponsor club.

Who decides where and when the Satellite Club meets?

The Satellite Club determines its meeting place and time in consultation with its Sponsor Club.

Does the Satellite Club meet with the Sponsor Club?

While a Satellite Club holds its regular meetings separately from its Sponsor Club, it is recommended they occasionally hold a joint meeting to discuss their annual goals and re-affirm their relationship.

Do Satellite Clubs need to set goals?

All Clubs, including Satellite Clubs, are strongly encouraged to set goals to achieve success.

Does someone who has only served as the Chair of a Satellite Club meet the qualifications for District Governor-Nominee?

No, only Rotary Club Presidents can be nominated for District Governor.

SET UP — YOUTH SERVICE

TUESDAY 22nd AUGUST

For Rotary:

1. Directorate nominated on Roster is responsible for set up and pack up. If not available please arrange own change.
2. **Set-Up**
 - a) Obtain code from Ann — 041 111 6480
 - b) Tables into correct position and to set tables with Cutlery, Rotary Placemats, Salt, Pepper, Serviettes, Water Carafes (*Note—tablecloths to be used only for 'special' occasions*)
 - c) To ensure that glasses are either placed on the tables or on the side with the wine/beer
 - d) To place on table with urn—mugs, spoons, tea, coffee etc. Ensure urn is turned on
 - e) Heaters on (as required)
 - f) Set up PA System
 - g) Assist with Attendance (check Weekly Duties list)
3. **Pack-Up** (assistance from all Rotarians appreciated)
 - a) Everything off tables and back to kitchen
 - b) Pack up PA system
 - c) When tablecloths are used, to take home and wash
 - d) Tables and chairs—put away
