The Uncommon Origins of Some Common Expressions

GIVE SOMEONE AN EVEN BREAK

‘Never give a sucker an even break’ was the legendary motto of the actor W.C. Fields, who used that piece of advice for the title of a film in 1941. Originally, however, it was hounds, not people, that were given an *even break*. Two dog owners, betting on the speed and abilities of their hounds at hare coursing, would have to release them at exactly the same moment—to give them an *even break*—to pursue the hare. In a slightly extended use, *even break* is now applied to dog races and horse races too, where it refers to a clean start to the race, in which all contestants get away at the same moment.

Another metaphor that comes from hare coursing is to *strain at the leash*. It refers not just to any dog impatient to be released from restraint, but more specifically to a coursing hound, quivering with excitement at the sight of a hare, and tugging desperately at the leash to be set free to pursue its quarry.



WORLD POLIO DAY 24th OCTOBER

Rotary, along with our partners, has reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent worldwide since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.
