TUESDAY 30th

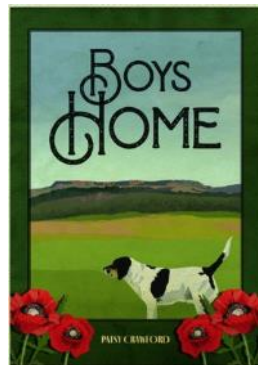

ROTARY HISTORY

EXPANDING OUR CRAFT FAIR

Continual upgrading and innovation has kept the Fair alive. Annual attractions for the public and awards for exhibitors have played a significant part.

Developments have included:

GUEST NATIONS—Over the years we have had Guest Nations. This is when we have attracted a group from another area or the world to bring their crafts to Deloraine to introduce ideas of another culture (eg Alaska, Denmark).

EMERGING ARTIST—Each year we invite an artisan who has shown huge potential within their chosen medium to be our guest at the Fair. A premium position is allocated and an introduction to all media is assured. This is seen as a launching pad for individuals who have achieved and now need the recognition to assist their career path.

FEATURE ARTIST— We select an artisan that excels in a particular medium to promote. The selection varies annually and can reflect the years' theme, product or medium.

FASHION PARADE—In 1998 a Fashion Parade was introduced, it was co-ordinated by Anne Hall-Brown from Southern Cross Country and proved a great success. All the clothing and accessories shown were originals from exhibitors within the Fair.

THE TASMANIAN EXHIBITION—This was introduced in 1998 and was a curated section. The exhibition was by invitation only and designed to have the cream of Tasmanian artisans display their works. An elite craft display and all items were available for purchase.

WEBSITE HISTORY—Over recent years the World Wide Web has provided our primary means documenting these Fair.

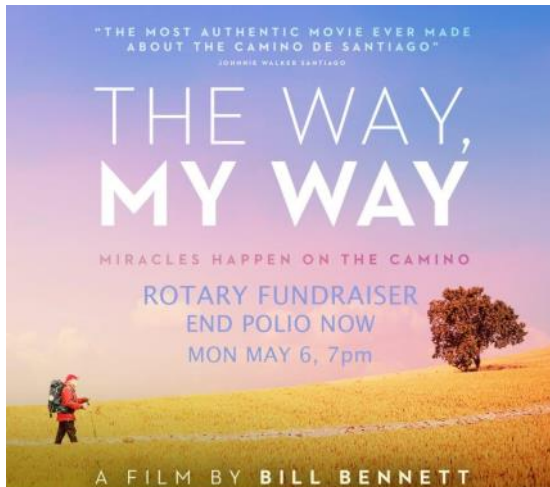

SET UP — PR & MEMBERSHIP

TUESDAY 23RD APRIL

For Rotary:

1. Directorate nominated on Roster is responsible for set up and pack up. If not available please arrange own change.
2. **Set-Up**
 - a) Obtain code from Ann — 041 111 6480
 - b) Tables into correct position and to set tables with Cutlery, Rotary Placemats, Salt, Pepper, Serviettes, Water Carafes
(Note—tablecloths to be used only for 'special' occasions)
 - c) To ensure that glasses are either placed on side table with drinks. Note: Only one bottle of red and one bottle of white to be opened at beginning of night, if more are required these are held at the President's table.
 - d) To place on table with urn—mugs, spoons, tea, coffee etc. Ensure urn is turned on
 - e) Heaters on (as required)
 - f) Set up PA System
 - g) Assist with Attendance (check Weekly Duties list)
3. **Pack-Up** (assistance from all Rotarians appreciated)
 - a) Everything off tables and back to kitchen
 - b) At the end of the night all opened bottles of wine should be removed from the Function Centre
 - c) Pack up PA system
 - d) When tablecloths are used, to take home and wash
 - e) Tables and chairs—put away
 - f) Check toilets
 - g) Lights off, lock up and keys back in box.
