2700km tandem ride for a good cause

TASMANIANS Phil and Joyce Ogden have been involved in tandem riding for years, but never did they envision crossing the Nullarbor.

The couple pedalled its tandem bicycle into Ceduna last week, as part of a journey from Perth to Adelaide - a trip of more than 2700km - on a fundraiser to support Rotary's End Polio Now campaign.

Phil had after bearing about a similar trek grew into the possibility of undertaking a ride that allowed the Ogdens to raise money and awareness in the fight against polio.

"I was not keen on him doing it on his own, but didn't have the desire to do it. We talked about it and then decided to do it as a charity ride," Joyce said.

The couple have long been supporters and donors to the End Polio Now cause since first bearing of the worldwide campaign, and for Phil there is also a personal tale to it.

The retired doctor said his brother recently informed him that he had polio as a youngster, something Phil did not know.

"My brother was in hospital for six weeks when I was five and I had no idea he had polio," he said.

"It can also bite you years later and my brother has it, he was labelled with chronic fatigue, but it is post-polio syndrome."

The Ogdens have been part of Rotary for many years and saw this as an opportunity to support the campaign.

"We have supported the fight against polio over the last 10 years, as it is possibly the only disease that can be completely eradicated by vaccination," Phil said.

"If we can immunise all on the planet, we have a shot to eradicate polio forever."

They said awareness of polio had waned, however with cases still present in the world it was vital to do what they could.

"We have met people who were vaccinated for polio as a baby, yet don't know about polio at all," Joyce said.

The Ogdens - who have been averaging about 1000km a day on the tandem bicycle - had a day of rest upon arriving in Ceduna last Wednesday, before setting off again on Friday.

Their next destination was Streaky Bay, before returning to Eyre Highway and continuing towards Port Augusta and through to Adelaide.

Along the way they have met with Rotary clubs in Perth and Kalgoorlie, and will meet

with South Australian clubs from Whyalla - with members to join them at Iron Knob - Port Augusta, Port Pirie, Clare and Gawler, as well as at the final destination in Adelaide.

Joyce said it was much colder and wetter along the Nullarbor than they had anticipated, but said they were thrilled to meet "some fabulous people doing extraordinary things" along the way.

They are about halfway to their funding goal of \$40,000. As of last Friday, a total of \$17,015 had been raised, with more money pledged by their local Rotary club in Lances-ton upon their return home.

In addition, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, which has a long-standing relationship with Rotary, will give twice the final amount raised.

"We have never done anything like this before and didn't know what to expect," Phil said.

The couple said they were grateful to those who had donated to the cause.

"We want to spread the word and raise as much as we can, as the younger generations need to realise how awful polio is," Joyce said.

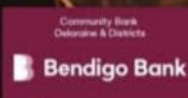
