The Uncommon Origins of Some Common Expressions

NAIL A LIE

Why do we speak of *nauling a lie*? Perhaps there is nothing more to the metaphor than the idea of pinning something firmly in place, so that it can be carefully examined, or immobilised.

In the past, *to nail* has also been the slang sense 'to kill' - in the Wild West, to nail someone was to shoot him dead. Perhaps, then, to *nail a lie* was simply to kill it, to put it out of circulation.

But there is a more colourful theory. An extended version of the phrase, seldom heard nowadays, is *to nail the lie to the counter*. In the 19th century America—so the story goes—when a storekeeper was offered a counterfeit coin by way of payment, he would drive a nail through it and fix it to the counter, displaying it prominently to public view as a warning to would-be-cheats.



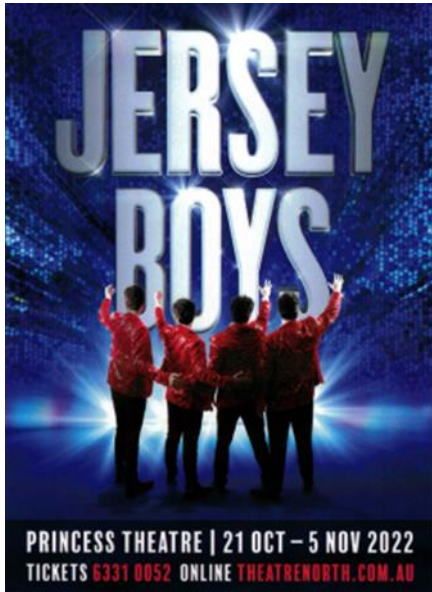
WORLD POLIO DAY 24th OCTOBER

Rotary, along with our partners, has reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent worldwide since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.
