ANZAC DAY 2025

“LEST WE FORGET”



The Ode of Remembrance is a poem that is commonly recited at Anzac Day services to commemorate wartime sacrifice.

*They shall grow not old, as we that
are left grow old:
Age shall not weary them, nor the
years condemn.
At the going down of the sun and
in the morning
We will remember them.*

The Ode comes from For the Fallen, a poem by English poet and writer Laurence Binyon. The poem was first published in The Times on 21st September, 1914. It was later published in the Wivining Fan - Poems of the Great War.

By mid-September 1914, less than seven weeks after the outbreak of war, the British Expeditionary Force in France had already suffered severe casualties. Long lists of the dead and wounded appeared in British newspapers. It was against this background that Binyon wrote *For the Fallen*.

The Ode is the fourth stanza of the poem. The verse, which became the League Ode, was already used in association with Anzac Day commemoration services in Australia in 1921.

Pam was born and grew up in Melbourne, moving to Tasmania in 1999. Tasmania has provided many opportunities for her that would otherwise not have been available both personally and professionally. Pam has a Bachelor of Applied Science degree and was initially employed in medical research, primarily in the area of high blood pressure research, before moving to forensic science. As a forensic scientist Pam has examined evidence relating to crime, attended crime scenes and given evidence in Courts of Law. Since moving to Tasmania in 1999, Pam initially carried out DNA profiling on forensic casework and now manages the Forensic Biology section. Pam has been fortunate to have the opportunity to contribute to the investigations relating to the Thailand tsunami and the Bali bombings, for Pam is also a Justice of the Peace for the State of Tasmania. Outside of work bushwalking has been a passion; day, overnight and multi-day walks. Pam has also led bushwalks and taught bushwalking and navigation skills and had great pleasure from seeing the new leaders and navigators gain confidence in their own abilities to lead and navigate – the old-fashioned way with map and compass! Pam also enjoys camping, travelling and gardening. Pam first joined Rotary in 2002 as a member of the Rotary Club of Salamanca but after several years work commitments made it difficult to continue with Rotary. Pam re-joined Rotary, again at the Rotary Club of Salamanca, in 2017 and since then has had various roles including Secretary, President and Assistant Governor for Group 1 clubs. In her time in Rotary Pam has participated in a number of Rotary programs including RYDA, RYPEN and NYSF and Pam is a Shelterbox Ambassador. Pam was awarded a Paul Harris Fellowship by the Rotary Club of Salamanca in 2021. Pam is keen to see knowledge and experience of Rotary increased throughout the community by promoting the work that Rotarians undertake.

SET UP — COMMUNITY SERVICE

TUESDAY 6TH MAY

For Rotary:

1. Directorate nominated on Roster is responsible for set up and pack up. If not available please arrange own change.
2. **Set-Up**
 - a) Obtain code from Ann — 041 111 6480
 - b) Tables into correct position and to set tables with Cutlery, Rotary Placemats, Salt, Pepper, Serviettes, Water Carafes
(Note—tablecloths to be used only for 'special' occasions)
 - c) To ensure that glasses are placed on side table with drinks.
Note: Only one bottle of red and one bottle of white to be opened at beginning of night, if more are required these are held at the President's table.
 - d) To place on table with 2 kettles—mugs, spoons, tea, coffee etc.
Ensure kettles are filled, power point on, and set kettles to boil
 - e) Heaters on (as required)
 - f) Set up PA System
 - g) Assist with Attendance (check Weekly Duties list)
3. **Pack-Up** (assistance from all Rotarians appreciated)
 - a) Everything off tables and back to kitchen
 - b) At the end of the night all opened bottles of wine should be removed from the Function Centre
 - c) Pack up PA system
 - d) When tablecloths are used, to take home and wash
 - e) Tables and chairs—put away
 - f) Check toilets
 - g) Lights off, lock up and keys back in box.
