SET UP — VOCATIONAL SERVICE

TUESDAY 15TH JULY

For Rotary:

1. Directorate nominated on Roster is responsible for set up and pack up. If not available please arrange own change.
2. **Set-Up**
 - a) Obtain code from Ann — 041 111 6480
 - b) Tables into correct position and to set tables with Cutlery, Rotary Placemats, Salt, Pepper, Serviettes, Water Carafes
(Note—tablecloths to be used only for 'special' occasions)
 - c) To ensure that glasses are placed on side table with drinks.
Note: Only one bottle of red and one bottle of white to be opened at beginning of night, if more are required these are held at the President's table.
 - d) To place on table with 2 kettles—mugs, spoons, tea, coffee etc.
Ensure kettles are filled, power point on, and set kettles to boil
 - e) Heaters on (as required)
 - f) Set up PA System
 - g) Assist with Attendance (check Weekly Duties list)
3. **Pack-Up** (assistance from all Rotarians appreciated)
 - a) Everything off tables and back to kitchen
 - b) At the end of the night all opened bottles of wine should be removed from the Function Centre
 - c) Pack up PA system
 - d) When tablecloths are used, to take home and wash
 - e) Tables and chairs—put away
 - f) Check toilets
 - g) Lights off, lock up and keys back in box.

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PRESIDENTS' REPORT

My second year as Rotary President has come to an end. I have enjoyed this year just as much as I did the first year but have relaxed a little more this year. It surprises me just how much I still don't know about Rotary. I think the Rotary journey is to continually learn and help where you can.

The year started off with my secretary, Liz Tomlinson, resigning due to family matters which meant I continued without a secretary. With the help of my Board members, we have continued to move forward in the club.



I was pleased to secure another Bendigo Bank Grant for \$16,500 to install 4 Heat Pumps in the Rotary Function Centre which has made a huge difference in heating (and cooling) the main area in the Function Centre. That combined with our solar panels and a new power tariff that we have changed will keep our power costs to a minimum when hiring the centre out.

During the year we have had numerous guest speakers visiting us, thank you to all the club members involved organising this to happen.



With the help from Youth Director Michael Swannell, we were able to supply and install 3 Rotary Peace Poles at Our Lady of Mercy, Deloraine and Mole Creek Primary Schools. Another 2 Peace Poles will be donated to Deloraine and Meander Community Houses this year.

We again sponsored the Vocational Training Awards, held in Launceston this year, Andrew Bartlett being chosen to enter. Andrew has decided to become a member of our club; we look forward to working with him and enjoying his company.

Our club also sponsored 2 swimming instructors from Mole Creek to qualify for our learn-to-swim programme held each year in January.

In early February we helped run the Pasifika festival held on the lawn outside of the Rotary Function Centre where we saw the island berry pickers dance to various traditional and non-traditional music. This was funded through a local council grant and was a great event enjoyed by

around 300 people.

We also sponsored 3 young people for a Tertiary Scholarship in their chosen fields, Emily for \$3,000 and 2 encouragement awards for \$1,000 each going to Ashleigh and Jacob.

We welcomed our Rotary exchange student, Sofia from Belgium who was hosted by Gayle and Michael Plunkett here in Deloraine and with another 2 hosts in Launceston.



We have had a busy enough year, and it will continue into this next phase where our new President will be in control.

May I take this opportunity to thank everyone in the club for supporting me throughout my 2 years of Presidency and wish Greg Burgess all the best for the coming year, thank you

Club Service differs from our other Committees in that it consists of a large number of individual roles and sub-committees. Thanks to everyone who took on roles within Club Service, assisting in the basic functioning of the Club.

There were many well deserved (and some undeserved) fines during the year, handed out by our Sergeants Maree and Anthea, as well as from the floor. Heads and Tails was performed with strict impartiality by John Tabor and Tim. Steen as Public Officer officiated at our AGM and also carried out the behind-the-scenes work associated with this role.

We had many excellent and varied guest speakers in the past year, thanks to our Program sub-committee of Ann and Maree and others in the Club who provided speaker suggestions.



Merrilyn organised the caterers for our dinner meetings. Compared to the time



when we first transferred our meetings to the Function Centre, when it was a struggle to find caterers, we now have a good roster of groups who provide the meals.

Ann produced the Bulletin on a weekly basis, a task which has very few breaks throughout the year. The effort she puts into the layout and keeping it fresh with jokes and other items of interest deserves particular acknowledgement.

The Function Centre continued to sustain a high level of external bookings, with Ann continuing in the Caretaker role. It also saw a significant



upgrade in the installation of new heating in Rotary Hall, with funds from a grant applied for by President Andrew. Andrew and Michael Plunkett also improved the security of the building by installing new locks after the break-in last year.

As Webmaster I created a new website for the Function Centre, after we were advised that the existing website was to be shut down by the provider. At the suggestion of Michael Plunkett I applied for the Club to have access to Microsoft's Non-profit program, which offers discounted and free software. After a lot of back and forth we were finally accepted in the last week; this will reduce the software costs associated with the Craft Fair and will also enable us to have shared file storage for things like Board minutes and Rotary History.

In addition to the people mentioned above, thanks to: Marc Smith for being our photographer; Ann for Family of Rotary; John Dare for Rotary information, Club History and the Function Centre Committee; Lois for Club property and Fellowship; Ann for meeting apologies; and Roy for Club History.

VOCATIONAL SERVICE

Once again we have been lucky enough to be able to give money for the Tasmanian Training Awards. The Vocational Student of the Year Award sponsored by the Rotary Club of Deloraine recognises outstanding achievement by a vocational student in a course of study leading to a nationally recognised qualification. There were 4 nominees in this category and the winner for 2024 was Andrew Bartlett who has a Certificate 3 in Individual Support (Disability). We at the club have been lucky enough to have Andrew as a guest speaker after his win to share his story and also to tell us how this award has been a wonderful experience for him



We also have again given Tertiary Scholarships for 2024/25. Thanks must go to Annette, John Tabor and Andrew Johnston for being willing to go on the interviewing panel (not an easy job). We had 6 applicants and in the end it was agreed the Emily S was given \$3,000 Emily has chosen to go to Sydney to study a Bachelor of Medicine/Science plus a Bachelor of International Studies. We also gave Jacob C \$1,000 Jacob is doing Flight Training in Hobart and \$1,000 to Ashleigh W doing Certificate 3 Early Childhood Educator in Launceston.

We did not find anyone to go to the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards this year but once again were pleased to be a Gold Sponsor for this event.

Unfortunately we have not had any vocational visits this year but we will endeavour to hopefully plan for some in the coming year.

YOUTH SERVICE

LEARN TO SWIM

As has been the case for many years we ran another successful Learn-to-Swim program in January. We had a turnout of 72 kids some who have been part of the program in past years and about a third that are home schooled. Much of the awareness was gained through Facebook as well as word of mouth. A big thanks to Margaret and Stephanie Amour a formidable mother and daughter team who have been instructors for many years. Unfortunately, they will not be able to continue in this role and finding replacement instructors has been an ongoing challenge. To address this the Board agreed to pay for two people to undertake a swimming instructor course on the basis that they commit to being the instructors for the 2026 program. Andrew Dare was able to identify two candidates through the Mole Creek Progress Association, and we now have two qualified instructors ready for the next program. To Lois, thank you again for your significant effort in keeping the program afloat and to others who helped over the two weeks. Get the word out to any mums, dads and kids that you have in your personal orbit – we want all kids to be water safe.

PEACE POLES

As part of the 2024 Rotary Peace Poles program, Deloraine Club committed to placing a pole at each of the three primary schools in our catchment area: Deloraine Primary, Mole Creek Primary, and Our Lady of Mercy. Andrew Dare and I attended an unveiling ceremony at each of the schools which included involvement from the students reading parts of the script so they got a better understanding of the importance and meaning behind the poles. The poles include the wording – *May Peace Prevail on Earth* – and each school decided on the additional languages to English they would include on their poles. The poles and ceremonies were received well by both staff and students and the Youth Services Committee will consider whether we hold ongoing annual ceremonies to remind staff and students of their meaning.



ROTARY YOUTH DRIVER AWARENESS

In September, we had a group of Deloraine members assisting with the District Rotary Youth Driver Awareness (RYDA) program. From all accounts it met the key objective of making young drivers safer and to that end it is a program that we will continue to support. YOUTH EXCHANGE PROGRAM

We welcomed Sofia Derouau from Belgium as our inbound student to Tasmania in September 2024. Sofia spent her first 3 months with her host family in Launceston and in December 2024 moved to Deloraine and Michael and Gayle Plunkett kindly agreed to host Sofia for the next 3-4 months. She has now moved back to Launceston to a new host family.



Molly Tillack-Smith who lives in Elizabeth Town left for Denmark in January 2025. She is fitting in very well and seems to be liking living in Denmark.

Molly joined an English-speaking debating team and has been participating in competitions. Molly has also thoroughly enjoyed the opportunities to travel to other countries and as well as places in Denmark. School is over for the summer break, and she joined other Rotary exchange students on a Eurotour which was a 14 day bus trip across Europe visiting places including Paris, Amsterdam, Austria Italy France Belgium, Czechia (Czech Republic), Germany, and Netherlands. We were fortunate to have Molly's mum, Alison to come along and speak at a club meeting in June to share a parents perspective. In my latest correspondence with Molly, she indicated an interest in being involved in Rotary when she returns later this year, so part of my job this coming year is to make sure we can harness her enthusiasm and get her involved.
